




#### Committed to our Mission

## Guide Dog Program

- 30 graduated guide dog teams.
- 20% growth in first time guide dog handlers.
- Hosted weekly online virtual meetings for guide dog alumni.
- Increased Graduate Outreach calls to stay connected.

## Service Dog Program

- 18 graduated service dog teams.
  - 10 dogs for autism8 dogs for veterans
- Modified curriculum that allowed for students to return to campus for class while maintaining health and safety measures.
- Created a puppy raising group in San Diego.

## **Events**

- Held our first virtual fundraising event, The Walk, Run, Ride...Whatever!
- Welcomed other creative virtual fundraising like yoga and a BBQ contest.
- The implementation of Salesforce- database platform- allows for more accurate information about events, funds raised, and participation.

- Partnered with Metro Link for a "Puppy Pop Up" event at Los Angeles Union Station.
- Successfully transitioned the canine development program online to stay connected with puppy raisers.

Luis, a new graduate from our veterans' program, reached the peak of independence with his new service dog, Shield.

"For some reason, hiking has been something I stopped doing due to the ever-growing lack of solitude and the large groups of people," said Luis. "The last few times I attempted to go for a hike, I saw so many cars and people in the parking area I couldn't bring myself to pull into the lot."

Even though it made him uncomfortable, Luis knew he and Shield could conquer a hike with some perseverance and teamwork. The COVID-19 pandemic left his neighborhood streets lonely and quiet — a silver lining of opportunity to work on being outside with no one around. Eventually, their early morning walks progressed into mid-day walks with more and more people around.

All the patience, practice, and trust Luis put into Shield prepared them for the milestone ahead. "With plenty of snacks and water, we made our way to the top of Iron Mountain and spent a few hours at the peak. As a team, we continue to break barriers I couldn't have done alone.
