"MADDY REJUVENATES ME!"

Luella Knapp doesn't seem like the type to need rejuvenating. At 88 years old, she still leads a very active life. But when a combination of glaucoma and macular degeneration began to take her sight more than five years ago, she relied more and more on her husband, Kenneth. When Kenneth passed away in 2001, Luella suddenly found herself having to learn to get around without sight.

"I couldn't drive anymore, and I had a very hard time using a white cane. I like to go someplace every day, but I kept getting into trouble. I would find myself in the middle of a street when the light changed. I often tripped over curbs. One time, I fell and hit my head very badly. It took months for the bump to go away."

Luella remembers the exact date she and Maddy, a black lab, started a new life.

"It was October 28, 2004 that we graduated. I fell in love with her right away. She's small, only 51 pounds, and she's smart and patient. And she's a great friend. Very talkative. The white cane couldn't talk to me."

With Maddy's help, Luella has resumed an active lifestyle that seems more suited to someone half her age. She line dances once a week, and square dances twice each week. She volunteers at the Center for the Blind to help others who are blind learn how to cook safely. She

Since she first contacted GDA five years ago, Sandy has become one of GDA's most consistent supporters. She sends monetary donations. She sends gifts of beds, toys, and other dog supplies. And since she and her husband Otto have written GDA into their wills, they are members of the "Partners in Trust Society." Not only that, but Sandy's mother, Helen Barnes, has also joined her in supporting GDA, and also recently added GDA to her will.

"When I was a college student, I was a reader for a blind student. Seeing what GDA's amaz-

is taking computer classes at the Braille Institute. She goes to church every Sunday.

And everywhere she goes, Maddy goes with her.

"She's so good. When I go to line dancing, I just tell her to stay and she sits quietly, ignoring all the noise and activity. The first time I took her to church with me, the minister was amazed to discover after the service that there had been a dog in the building. Now, when we go, as soon as the organist plays the benediction, Maddy knows it's time to leave. She's so smart.

"My only problem is that everywhere I go, people want to pet her because she's so cute. One woman who is legally blind came up to me and asked me where I got Maddy and how much it

ing dogs do for students is very satisfying. Watching them work is incredible. I've just become so convinced of the value of this organization to change people's lives. If I lived closer, I'd want to volunteer

"One thing I like about GDA," Sandy says, "is that it's a relatively small organization, so we can have a real impact.

"When I went back to California for a doctor's appointment, my mother came with me and we made sure to visit the school. I was so impressed. On another trip, we attended a graduation. That was a very emotional day. Hearing the students talk about how their lives would be changed by having a guide dog just convinced me even more.

"Putting GDA in our will seems like the right thing to do. It will allow our support to keep going after we're gone."

Sandy and Otto have always been dog lovers, so supporting an organization that produces wonderful guide dogs interested them. They currently share their lives with two dogs, Gypsy, a ten year old Brittany Spaniel, and Cinder, a 6 month old Weimaraner.

Maybe it's because they are dog lovers that Sandy and Otto are excited about our newest sponsorship program opportunities. They contributed \$1,000 to sponsor a "newborn" puppy which covers the cost of breeding and delivery. They

Jay A. Bormann GDA President Because the devastation caused by Hurricane Katrina was so widespread and so heartbreaking, GDA has tried to respond in some small way to help our two-footed and four-footed friends in need.

The International Association of Machinist and Aerospace Workers (IAM&AW) founded Guide Dogs of America more than 50 years ago. And though our two organizations are now separate, GDA has continued to be their favorite charity. In response to those decades of generosity and kindness, we helped the IAM&AW with supplies and support who, in turn, helped their fellow IAM&AW members, GDA graduates, and other friends who resided in the hurricane affected areas.

One of the great tragedies of the New Orleans disaster is that thousands of pets had to be abandoned when the city was evacuated. Many of these dogs won't be able to be reunited with their owners and are being sent to adoption centers all over the country. We're assisting Southern California Labrador Retriever Rescue by housing up to 18 dogs they have accepted. After medical and temperament check-ups, the dogs will be housed at our kennels until new homes can be found for them.
