

Despite the challenges presented this past year, Guide Dogs of America has remained operational, providing essential human services to people with disabilities. By following recommended safety protocols, GDA has continued to fulfill its mission to transform lives through partnerships with service dogs.


#### **Events**

## Jim and Service Dog, Triton

Jim Reed is a combat Vietnam Veteran who served in the 173rd Airborne for 18 months. During his service, he was exposed to Agent Orange and has PTSD. His service dog, Triton, was trained in GDA's service dog program at Mule Creek State Prison.

"My name is Jim Reed, and this is my new friend Triton. It's been a long time since I've had a friend and even longer since I've wanted one. When I first got to GDA, I was really nervous, but with Triton by my side, I have felt a feeling of easiness and calmness that I thought I left somewhere in the past. **At night in the darkest hours, 1968 comes looking for me just like it always does, but now Triton will be there to wake me up and bring me back home.** I've been told that Triton is a tool to help me navigate through life, which he is. But I also think of him as my guardian angel, and for that, I thank everyone involved in this program from the bottom of my heart."

- New HVAC and air filtration systems
- Updated plumbing and electrical systems
- UV disinfectant lighting system
- New sanitized feeding and fresh water systems
- Airtight, non-porous epoxy flooring
- Innovative cleaning, drainage and waste mechanisms
- Customized indoor/outdoor modular kennel system
- Upgraded fencing and concrete flooring
