Guide Dogs for Individuals Who Are Visually Impaired

Our Guide Dogs for the visually impaired help our clients travel with confidence and safety, bringing new opportunities for life experiences.

Requirements

- Legally blind
- At least 18 years of age
- Completed Orientation and Mobility training and travel independently with a cane

Service Dogs for Veterans

Our service dogs help veterans suffering from PTSD or a mobility limitation gain greater independence and reintegrate into society. They are task trained to respond to emotional triggers and retrieve objects.

Requirements (one of the following)

- Post-traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD)
- Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI)
- Mobility limiting disability

Service Dogs for Children with Autism

Our service dogs help children with autism gain confidence and experience newly found social interactions, encouraging positive communication.

Requirements

- Diagnosis of autism
- Four to 12 years of age
- · Parent/guardian is primary handler of the dog

Service Dogs for Facilities

Our facility dogs that are placed in institutional settings are task trained to provide intervention and therapy to people with disabilities and victims of crime, and can motivate children to stay engaged in educational settings.

Requirements

- Medical facilities/rehabilitation facilities
- Courtrooms/government institutions
- · Schools/learning facilities
- Police Departments
