All programs and services, including transportation, personalized training, room/board, and postgraduate support, are provided at no cost to the recipient.

OUR GUIDE DOGS FOR PEOPLE WHO ARE BLIND OR VISUALLY IMPAIRED improve our clients' mobility and bring new opportunities for life experiences and social interaction. These highly trained canines help our clients travel safely from one destination to the next.

OUR SERVICE DOGS FOR VETERANS help heroes reintegrate into society by alleviating their PTSD symptoms and assisting with mobility limitations. They are trained to provide grounding or sensory input to decrease the physiological symptoms of stress/anxiety.
